

GUADALÍS DEL CARMEN (Playwright, she/her/ella) is a playwright, screenwriter, and performer from Chicago, based in NYC. She's a writer for the first season of HBOMax's tv adaptation of Stephen King's It, Welcome to Derry, and has worked on development projects at FX and Amazon. Guadalís is an Ars Nova PlayGroup Alum, 2020 Steinberg Playwriting Award recipient, and Yale Rep Commissioned Artist. Her plays include NOT FOR SALE (UrbanTheater Company, Joseph Jefferson Award New Play Nominee 2019), MY FATHER'S KEEPER (The Kilroys Honorable Mention 2019), DAUGHTERS OF THE REBELLION (Montclair State University 2019, The Kilroys Honorable Mention 2017), A Shero's Journey or What Anacaona and Yemayá Taught Me (Yale Magazine 2019, The Parsnip Ship Podcast Season 4), BLOWOUT (Aguijón Theater 2013). BEES & HONEY was originally developed in The Sol Project's SolFest in 2018, and received additional development through LAByrinth Theater; it was also part of The Kilroys List in 2019. Guadalís was a Co-Producer of Atlantic Theater Company's African Caribbean MixFest 2021. She's the Co-Founder and Co-Artistic Director of Latinx Playwrights Circle (LPC), an organization dedicated to developing and nurturing Latinx(e) playwrights and their plays. LPC was a co-producing partner alongside WP Theater and The Sol Project for the Off Broadway production of Christin Eve Cato's SANCOCHO. Guadalís has performed in Chicago, NYC, The Repertory of St. Louis, and Actors Theater of Louisville.

MELISSA CRESPO (*Director*, she/her/hers) Born and raised in CT, Melissa is a Dominican, Chilean, and Puerto Rican director of new plays, musicals, and opera. She has developed work at The O'Neill, Lark Play Development Center, Playwright's Center, New Dramatists, and more. She is currently the Associate Artistic Director at Syracuse Stage where she has directed NATIVE GARDENS, I AND YOU, YOGA PLAY, and ESPEJOS: CLEAN. As a playwright, her play EGRESS, co-written with Sarah Saltwick has been produced at Salt Lake Acting Company, Amphibian Stage, and Cleveland Playhouse. Melissa received her MFA in Directing from The New School for Drama and is a Founding Editor of 3Views on Theater.

MARIBEL MARTINEZ (Johaira) is a multi-hyphenate artist, proudly Black-Latina, with Dominican and Puerto Rican roots. She's been involved with BEES & HONEY since its first staged reading at SOL Project's SOLFest in 2018, and is honored to bring Johaira to life for its world premiere. Simultaneously he was contacted by a long time friend to help with the art direction of his new restaurant. Before he knew it he was back in his roots painting and collaborating with small businesses on art direction for their spaces. After creating a local buzz as a muralist bigger brands began

THE SOL PROJECT is a national theater initiative dedicated to producing the work of Latiné playwrights in New York City and beyond. Founded in 2016, The Sol Project works in partnership with leading Off-Broadway and regional theaters to amplify Latiné voices and build artistic homes for artists of color. Through the writers they champion, The Sol Project aspires to create a bold, powerful, and kaleidoscopic body of work for the new American theater. The Sol Project launched with the world premiere of ALLIGATOR by Hilary Bettis (New Georges), followed by the New York premieres of SEVEN SPOTS ON THE SUN by Martín Zimmerman (Rattlestick Playwrights Theater) and OEDIPUS EL REY by Luis Alfaro (The Public Theater) in 2017. In the fall of 2018, The Sol Project partnered with Yale Repertory Theatre to produce the world premiere of EL HURACÁN by Charise Castro Smith and in early 2020, partnered with Baltimore Center Stage and The Playwrights Realm to produce the world premiere of RICHARD & JANE & DICK & SALLY by Noah Diaz. In 2022, The Sol Project is partnering with Soho Rep and MCC Theater to produce the world premieres of NOTES ON KILLING SEVEN OVERSIGHT, MANAGEMENT, AND ECONOMIC STABILITY BOARD MEMBERS by Mara Vélez Meléndez and BEES & HONEY by Guadalís Del Carmen, respectively. In addition, The Sol Project produces an annual summer play festival – SolFest – in partnership with Pregones/ Puerto Rican Traveling Theatre to seed the field with new work driven by Latiné playwrights, directors, and actors.

THE TELSEY OFFICE (*Casting*) With offices in both New York and Los Angeles, The Telsey Office casts for theater, film, television, and commercials. The Telsey Office is dedicated to creating safe, equitable, and anti-racist spaces through collaboration, artistry, heart, accountability, and advocacy.

ACTORS' EQUITY ASSOCIATION ("Equity"), founded in 1913, is the U.S. labor union that represents more than 51,000 professional Actors and Stage Managers. Actors' Equity is a member of the AFL-CIO and is affiliated with FIA, an international organization of performing arts unions. Equity is governed by its own members through an elected Council, representing principal actors, chorus actors and stage managers living in three regions: Eastern, Central and Western. MCC THEATER was founded in 1986 as MANHATTAN CLASS COMPANY by a collective of young actors, writers, and directors determined to steer their own artistic development—and shake things up! That initial group included Artistic Directors **Bernie Telsey, Bob LuPone** and **Will Cantler**, since joined by Executive Director **Blake West**. Our increasingly expansive work continues today.

EDUCATION PROGRAMS

After seamlessly transitioning to fully remote programming in March 2020, then hybrid after-school and inschool programs in 2021-2022, we are thrilled to be back fully inperson for performances of Performance Lab's UNCENSORED, BKYC UNCENSORED and the Playwriting Lab's FRESHPLAY FESTIVAL in Spring and Summer 2023.

We continue the long and valued relationships with our four partner schools: Manhattan International High School, Baruch College Campus High School, The George Washington High School Educational Campus in Manhattan, and The High School for Public Service in Brooklyn. We are committed to providing quality arts-based education because youth voices matter and creating an inclusive space where everyone's stories are heard can inspire change in ourselves and in society.

THE ROBERT W. WILSON MCC THEATER SPACE

Inaugurated on JAN 9, 2019, MCC's Hell's Kitchen home, THE ROBERT W. WILSON MCC THEATER SPACE, is a state-of-the-art complex designed for us to do what we do best: shake things up. The space houses two theaters, two rehearsal studios, extensive backstage facilities, administrative offices, and ample audience amenities.

THE NEWMAN MILLS THEATER is named for Ruth & Harold† Newman and Marianne & Steve Mills. As dedicated co-chairs of The Campaign for MCC THEATER, they led a successful fundraising effort in support of MCC's education and artistic programs.

THE SUSAN & RONALD FRANKEL THEATER is named for Susan & Ronald Frankel. They have been active with the company since 2015. Susan Frankel is also an MCC THEATER Board member.

ROBERT W. WILSON was a well-known and successful investor from the mid-1960's to the mid-1980's. After retirement, he devoted his life to philanthropy. He was a transformative philanthropist, primarily funding worldwide organizations in the preservation and conservation areas. An avid New Yorker, he was also involved with a number of New York's cultural institutions. He was a major supporter of, and held leadership roles with, the Brooklyn Botanic Garden, Environmental Defense Fund, The Metropolitan Opera, the Whitney Museum, and the World Monuments Fund. In addition, he and the Trust continue to support the above institutions and The Nature Conservancy, The New York Public Library, Central Park Conservancy, BAM, and the Wildlife Conservation Society.



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ABOUT THE SOL PROJECT

The Sol Project is an Obie-award winning national theater initiative dedicated to amplifying the voices of Latiné playwrights in NYC and beyond. Founded by Jacob G. Padrón and driven by an artistic collective, The Sol Project works in partnership with leading theaters to center Latiné dramatists and nurture a growing community of Latiné theater artists. With the writers we champion, The Sol Project aspires to create a bold, timeless, and kaleidoscopic body of work for the new American theater.

The Sol Project launched in 2016 with the world premiere of ALLIGATOR by Hilary Bettis in collaboration with New Georges, followed by the New York premieres of SEVEN SPOTS ON THE SUN by Martín Zimmerman (Rattlestick Playwrights Theater) and Oedipus El Rey by Luis Alfaro (The Public Theater). In the fall of 2018, The Sol Project collaborated with Yale Repertory Theatre to produce the world premiere of EL HURACAN by Charise Castro Smith and in early 2020 partnered with Baltimore Center Stage and The Playwrights Realm to produce the world premiere of RICHARD & JANE & DICK & SALLY by Noah Diaz. In 2022, The Sol Project partnered with Soho Rep for the world premiere of NOTES ON KILLING SEVEN OVERSIGHT, MANAGEMENT AND ECONOMIC STABILITY BOARD MEMBERS by Mara Vélez Meléndez. And in spring of 2023, The Sol Project will partner with MCC Theater for the world premiere of BEES & HONEY by Guadalís Del Carmen, as well as WP Theater and Latinx Playwrights Circle for the Off-Broadway premiere of SANCOCHO by Christin Eve Cato. In addition to productions, The Sol Project advances its mission by producing a yearly new play festival, SolFest, in partnership with Pregones/Puerto Rican Traveling Theater, while also supporting writers through readings, workshops, a podcast (SolTalk), and ongoing symposia. In 2023, The Sol Project was awarded an Obie Grant, Off-Broadway's highest honor, for their unprecedented championing and support of Latiné voices in the theater and in recognition of outstanding achievement in Off-Broadway and Off-Off-Broadway theater during the 2020-2022 season.

The artistic collective includes Adriana Gaviria (Co-Artistic Director), Rebecca Martínez, David Mendizábal, Jacob G. Padrón (Co-Artistic Director), Julian Ramirez, and Laurie Woolery. George Strus is the Artistic Producer. Isabel Pask is the Producing Associate. Brian Herrera is the Resident Scholar. Stephanie Ybarra is the Resident Dramaturg.
