**SCOTT BAKULA** (Conrad O'Brien) has been recognized for his work in a variety of mediums, from feature films to television to musical theatre and more.

Born in St. Louis, Bakula moved to New York in 1976. He made his Broadway debut in 1983, starring as Joe DiMaggio in MARILYN: AN AMERICAN FABLE In 1988, he was honored with a Tony nomination for his starring role in the Broadway musical ROMANCE/ROMANCE.

Bakula made his UK stage debut in the world premiere of TERRIBLE ADVICE at the Menier Chocolate Factory, directed by Frank Oz. Throughout his career, Bakula has continued to return to the stage, appearing at the famed Hollywood Bowl in "An Evening with Carol Burnett" and the summer musical production of GUYS AND DOLLS. Over the past few years, he has also starred in DANCING IN THE DARK at San Diego's Old Globe Theater, and Jane Anderson's QUALITY OF LIFE at the Geffen Playhouse. His other theatre credits include NO STRINGS at UCLA's Freud Playhouse, directed by Kay Cole, and a production of the Tony Award-winning musical SHENANDOAH at the historic Ford's Theater in Washington, DC, directed by Jeff Calhoun. Further stage credits include the critically acclaimed Off-Broadway production of THREE GUYS NAKED FROM THE WAIST DOWN, and the Los Angeles and Boston productions of NITE CLUB CONFIDENTIAL. Bakula also sang at the Kennedy Center Honors for Stephen Sondheim and Carol Burnett.

Television fans know Bakula for his five-year stint on the innovative series "Quantum Leap." For his multi-faceted portrayal of time traveler Sam Beckett, he won a Golden Globe, in addition to earning four Emmy nominations. He is also known for "NCIS: New Orleans," "Star Trek Enterprise," "Men of a Certain Age," and the critically acclaimed HBO film "Behind the Candelabra," for which he received an Emmy nomination.

**JASON ROBERT BROWN** is best known for his scores to several of the most renowned musicals of our time, including his two previous collaborations with director Daisy Prince: the 1995 song cycle SONGS FOR A NEW WORLD and the generation-defining THE LAST FIVE YEARS.

THE CONNECTOR is Jason's eighth full-length musical, adding to a body of work that includes PARADE, written with Alfred Uhry and directed by Harold Prince, which garnered Jason the Tony Award for Original Score; and THE BRIDGES OF MADISON COUNTY, a musical adapted with Marsha Norman from the bestselling novel, for which Jason received two Tony Awards (for Best Score and Orchestrations). His other musicals are HONEYMOON IN VEGAS, 13 (which became a Netflix film in 2022), and MR. SATURDAY NIGHT, written with Amanda Green and starring Billy Crystal. Richard LaGravenese's film of THE LAST FIVE YEARS was released in 2015. PARADE has been the subject of two major revivals: the first, directed by Rob Ashford, at London's Donmar Warehouse and then at the Mark Taper Forum in Los Angeles; and the second, Michael Arden's acclaimed Tony Award-winning Best Revival of a Musical, starring Ben Platt and Micaela Diamond.

As a soloist or with his band, Jason has performed concerts around the world. For six years, his monthly sold-out performances at New York's SubCulture featured many of the music and theater world's most extraordinary performers, including a sold-out concert at Town Hall with Stephen Sondheim. His previous albums, "How We React and How We Recover" and "Wearing Someone Else's Clothes" are available from Ghostlight Records. Jason's 2012 concert with Anika Noni Rose was broadcast on PBS, and he was the featured soloist for an episode of BBC Radio's long-running "Friday Night Is Music Night," broadcast live from the London Palladium and featuring the BBC Concert Orchestra. His collaboration with singer Lauren Kennedy, "Songs of Jason Robert Brown," is available on PS Classics. Jason conducted his orchestral adaptation of E.B. White's novel "The Trumpet of the Swan" with the National Symphony Orchestra. In 2017, Jason was the arranger and music supervisor for "Prince of Broadway," a celebration of the work of his mentor, Harold Prince. He has contributed music to the hit Nickelodeon television series, "The Wonder Pets," as well as "Sesame Street." Jason spent ten years teaching at the USC School of Dramatic Arts, and has also taught at Harvard University, Princeton University and Emerson College.

MIDNIGHT IN THE GARDEN OF GOOD AND EVIL, a new musical written with Taylor Mac based on John Berendt's book and directed by Rob Ashford, premiering this summer at Chicago's Goodman Theater. Jason is the winner of the 2018 Louis Auchincloss Prize, the 2002 Kleban Award for Outstanding Lyrics and the 1996 Gilman & Gonzalez-Falla Foundation Award for Musical Theatre. 

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## **OUR MISSION**

Our mission is to provoke conversations that have never happened and otherwise never would.

MCC THEATER was founded in 1986 as MANHATTAN CLASS COMPANY by a collective of young actors, writers, and directors determined to steer their own artistic development—and shake things up! That initial group included Artistic Directors **Bernie Telsey**, **Bob LuPone** and **Will Cantler**, since joined by Executive Director **Blake West**. Our increasingly expansive work continues today, in fond memory of Bob.

**WE PRODUCE EXCITING THEATER**. We produce seasons of BOLD new plays and musicals by exceptional ARTISTS.

**WE DEVELOP NEW WORK**. We develop NEW WORK by emerging and established artists through a rigorous process that encourages CREATIVE RISK-TAKING.

**WE HONOR YOUNG VOICES**. Each year our education programs use the power of theater to ROUSE the imaginations of over 1200 high school STUDENTS across ALL FIVE BOROUGHS.

**WE GET PEOPLE TALKING**. COLLABORATION and COMMUNITY are at the core of everything we do.

# EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS



Over twenty years ago, MCC Theater initiated a series of intensive in-school and after-school education programs that now serve approximately 700 New York City public high school students each year, offering them a platform to be heard and the opportunity to speak their truth. The goal of this work is to celebrate and honor the mosaic of identities of New York City's young people and their experiences in a non-competitive and socially conscious environment.

MCC's Youth Company serves NYC high school students through the Performance Lab, Playwriting Lab, the Ambassadors, and Brooklyn Youth Company. Participants attend weekly meetings that focus on ensemble building, devising, and writing. Company members also attend professional productions around New York City and master classes with guest artists during school breaks throughout the year. Performance Lab and Brooklyn Youth Company culminate in an annual original collaborative production titled UNCENSORED. Playwriting Lab ends their program with the FRESHPLAY FESTIVAL, where young writers' new plays are shared by professional actors and directors in two days of play readings. Ambassadors meet monthly to gain a fuller understanding of the industry by learning about a broad range of theater professions and visit non-profit theaters across the city.

Through **Classroom Partnerships**, MCC collaborates with New York City public high schools to integrate sequential arts curricula into English, Art, and Social Studies classes. The schools participating during the 2023-24 season are the George Washington High School Educational Campus, Baruch College Campus High School, Manhattan International High School, and the High School for Public Service, which also hosts the Brooklyn Youth Company.

Student Matinees make it possible for public schools with limited access to performing arts organizations to attend MCC productions.

## PUBLIC ENGAGMENT



In support of our mission to provoke conversations, MCC has created a full suite of free public engagement programs serving over 1000 people annually that center our mainstage productions and the themes that those works address.

**LET'S TALK**: Post-show Talkbacks offer audiences an opportunity to ask questions of the cast and creative teams. In Post-show Audience Conversations audiences engage with one another in conversations about the play they have just seen.

**LET'SENGAGE**: OpenForums and Workshops feature activities and subject matter that uplift issues highlighted in our mainstage productions and are designed to enhance engagement, giving participants an opportunity to reflect on the work.

**LET'S WATCH**: Community nights offer social opportunities before shows for audience members to connect with each other and learn more about resources available to artists throughout the city.

ROBERT W. WILSON MCC THEATER SPACE, is a state-of-the-art complex designed for us to do what we do best: shake things up. The space houses two theaters, two rehearsal studios, extensive backstage facilities, administrative offices, and ample audience amenities.

**THE NEWMAN MILLS THEATER** is named for Ruth & Harold† Newman and Marianne & Steve Mills. As dedicated co-chairs of The Campaign for MCC THEATER, they led a successful fundraising effort in support of MCC's education and artistic programs.

THE SUSAN & RONALD FRANKEL THEATER is named for Susan & Ronald Frankel. They have been active with the company since 2015. Susan Frankel is also an MCC THEATER Board member.

ROBERT W. WILSON was a well-known and successful investor from the mid-1960's to the mid-1980's. After retirement, he devoted his life to philanthropy. He was a transformative philanthropist, primarily funding worldwide organizations in the preservation and conservation areas. An avid New Yorker, he was also involved with a number of New York's cultural institutions. He was a major supporter of, and held leadership roles with, the Brooklyn Botanic Garden, Environmental Defense Fund, The Metropolitan Opera, the Whitney Museum, and the World Monuments Fund. In addition, he and the Trust continue to support the above institutions and The Nature Conservancy, The New York Public Library, Central Park Conservancy, BAM, and the Wildlife Conservation Society.

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
