Spector's plays have been produced On and Off Broadway, regionally, and abroad with Manhattan Theater Club, The Old Vic/Sonia Friedman Productions, 59E59, Hampstead Theater, Pasadena Playhouse, Huntington Theater, Theater J, Marin Theater, Aurora Theater, Colt Coeur, Miami New Drama, Vienna's Burgtheater, and Dublin's Gate Theater, among others. He is currently under commission with Manhattan Theater Club, Roundabout, La Jolla Playhouse and Trafalgar Theater, proudly serves on the Dramatists Guild Council and was a writer/producer on the upcoming Netflix series "THE RETRIEVALS."

TEDDY BERGMAN (Director) is a Drama Desk nominated director, producer and actor. Recent work includes acclaimed productions like MOTHER RUSSIA at Signature Theatre (NYTimes Critics Pick, Lortel Nom), URINETOWN for NYCC Encores! (NYTimes Critics Pick, Drama League Nom.), and LIFE AND TRUST, the massive immersive experience from the producers of SLEEP NO MORE. Other work includes the groundbreaking Broadway musical KPOP, the critically acclaimed EMPIRE TRAVEL AGENCY and the award-winning, immersive iteration of KPOP (Lortel Winner for Outstanding Musical, Rodgers Award) with his company Woodshed Collective. His work has been seen at Lincoln Center (in collaboration with Clint Ramos), The Park Avenue Armory, The Public Theater, Roundabout, Williamstown, NYTW, MTC, Ars Nova, Ma-Yi, Pasadena Playhouse, Miami New Drama, The Mercury Store and more. His work with pop acts includes the co-creation and direction of Tegan and Sara's tour Hey, I'm Just Like You, and creative direction for Sara Bareilles's upcoming Good Grief tour. He's a founder of Ad Hoc - creators and producers of original and large-scale live entertainment. Acting work includes originating roles on and off-Broadway and in numerous films and television shows.

HALE APPLEMAN (Lev) also played Lev in the Miami New Drama production of BIRTHRIGHT at the Colony Theatre. Further stage credits include the revival of David Rabe's STREAMERS (Roundabout), the New York premiere of Sarah Ruhl's PASSION PLAY (Epic Theatre), as well as productions with The Public Theater, EST, ART, The Old Globe, Berkshire Theatre Festival, L.A. LEARNING & CULTURE

Driven by our mission to provoke conversations, we are committed to using the power of theater to ask some of the essential questions of our times. Our **LEARNING** programs break down barriers to embolden students and young audiences to deepen their curiosity and find confidence in their voices. Those voices are uplifted as their words are woven together to form the fabric of our in-school partnerships, **UNCENSORED**, Brooklyn Youth Company **UNCENSORED**, and **FRESHPLAY** performances.

In our **Playwriting Lab**, each company member develops an original script through weekly workshops where they receive the support of their peers and the mentorship of professional playwright JUAN RAMIREZ JR. Each December, participants see their work come to life in our **FRESHPLAY DISCOVERY** series. Select students will continue to develop their plays through the spring for our **FRESHPLAY FESTIVAL**, which features a public reading of their work with professional actors and directors.

In our **Performance Lab**, participants collaborate to create an original play under the leadership of professional theater artist KAREEM M LUCAS. The ensemble explores weekly exercises in voice, movement, writing, and devising. The process culminates in an original production of **UNCENSORED** that aims to reflect the world they live in and imagine the world they wish to create.

The **Brooklyn Youth Company**, which operates in the same spirit and process as our Performance Lab, is open to all students at High School for Public Service in East Flatbush. This school partnership emphasizes building community and introduces students to the creative process while they collaborate to create and perform their own original **UNCENSORED** production under the leadership of CLOTEAL L. HORNE and MARISSA STEWART.

The **Ambassadors Program (AMBIES)** is open to emerging theater artists between the ages of 21 and 30 with an interest in producing and administration. This program aims to demystify the NYC theatrical landscape through monthly curated conversations and workshops at the MCC Theater Space as well as off-site visits and theater-going opportunities.

For twenty years, MCC Theater has forged relationships with New York City public high schools through our **Classroom Partnerships**. These collaborations are rooted in the needs and interests of each partner school. Our teaching artists partner with school teachers to integrate theater into classroom learning with the goals of enlivening curriculum, fostering conversations, and encouraging creative expression.

HOW TO JOIN: Auditions for the Youth Company are open to all NYC High School students. Auditions for Playwriting Lab will be in October 2026 and in January 2027 for Performance Lab. For more information about the Labs and how to get involved with the Youth Company, email education@mcctheater.org.

Inaugurated on JAN 9, 2019, MCC's Hell's Kitchen home, **THE ROBERT W. WILSON MCC THEATER SPACE**, is a state-of-the-art complex designed for us to do what we do best: shake things up. The space houses two theaters, two rehearsal studios, extensive backstage facilities, administrative offices, and ample audience amenities.

THE NEWMAN MILLS THEATER is named for Ruth & Harold[†] Newman and Marianne & Steve Mills. As dedicated co-chairs of The Campaign for MCC THEATER, they led a successful fundraising effort in support of MCC's education and artistic programs.

THE SUSAN & RONALD FRANKEL THEATER is named for Susan & Ronald Frankel. They have been active with the company since 2015. Susan Frankel is also an MCC THEATER Board member.

ROBERT W. WILSON was a well-known and successful investor from the mid-1960's to the mid-1980's. After retirement, he devoted his life to philanthropy. He was a transformative philanthropist, primarily funding worldwide organizations in the preservation and conservation areas. An avid New Yorker, he was also involved with a number of New York's cultural institutions. He was a major supporter of, and held leadership roles with, the Brooklyn Botanic Garden, Environmental Defense Fund, The Metropolitan Opera, the Whitney Museum, and the World Monuments Fund. In addition, he and the Trust continue to support the above institutions and The Nature Conservancy, The New York Public Library, Central Park Conservancy, BAM, and the Wildlife Conservation Society.
